Family: God's Divine Plan and Structure

Family: God's Divine Plan and Structure

The concept of family is woven throughout the Bible as a central element of God's divine plan for humanity. Here, the concept of family is extended to the spiritual community, showing that through Christ, we are all adopted into God's divine family.

In this parable, a father welcomes his wayward son back home with open arms, illustrating God's endless mercy and forgiveness. This story reminds us that no matter how broken a family may become, God's grace offers a pathway to healing and reconciliation.

The Eternal Significance of Family
